



AGING AND CAREGIVING IN IOWA

lowa's population is aging, and there's a huge shortage of paid caregivers - leaving an estimated 350,000 lowan family caregivers to fill the gaps in the medical system. What solutions are possible?

HOW WILL NEW TECH RE-SHAPE HEALTH CARE?

Robotics, personalized medicine, big data, machine learning and more are already starting to impact health care - and are poised to make an even bigger mark in the next 10 years.

Regionalism / Workforce Sessions include:

WORKFORCE NEEDS OF THE NEXT 10 YEARS

In a rapidly changing economy, what skills will be most in-demand and how will we prepare lowans to thrive? We'll hear from industry professionals, economists and education experts.

IMMIGRANTS IN THE WORKFORCE


